Over 10,000 people from across the state marched in front of the state capital, showing their support of a bill that prohibited discrimination in public accommodations. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. spoke to the multitude of people. The march led to the passage of the Kentucky Civil Rights Act. The march gained national attention.

The battle toward civil rights continues. Thousands of people are unable to vote or have full citizenship in our state. Even more, thousands of immigrants are further marginalized. Thousands of immigrant families live in the shadow, live with fear of deportation, and suffer family separations. Prejudice, discrimination, and inequality still exist in our society.

The March in Frankfort on March 5, 2014 opens an opportunity to further common civil rights, so every person will have full citizenship in our great state and nation.

The march starts on Second Street and Capital Avenue at 9:00am and ends at 12:00pm EST.
