

Our work in the courtroom and legislature guarantees all loving couples can now obtain marriage licenses in Kentucky without fear of discrimination, and reminds government officials that withholding government services for personal religious reasons does not promote religious freedom but rather undermines it.






Kentucky Smart on Crime is a broad based coalition working for common sense justice reforms that enhance public safety, strengthen communities and promote cost effective sentencing alternatives. Its member organizations include the ACLU of Kentucky, Kentucky Chamber of Commerce, Catholic Conference of Kentucky, Kentucky Center for Economic Policy, Bluegrass Institute for Public Policy Solutions, Kentucky Council of Churches and Kentucky Youth Advocates.

The newly formed coalition celebrated a great legislative victory in the 2016 General Assembly with the passage of felony expungement legislation that allows certain class D felonies to be expunged from a returning citizen's record.

As Kentucky Smart on Crime turns its focus to meaningful penal code reform in the upcoming 2017 General Assembly, we are proud to have a representative serving on the Governor's newly constituted Criminal Justice Policy Assessment Council. \mathbf{C}

We are standing up for reproductive freedom in the face of attempts to legislate and regulate abortion out of existence in the commonwealth. The U.S. Supreme Court's ruling in Whole Women's Health v. Hellerstedt, declaring sham laws that do nothing to protect a woman's health are unconstitutional, means we have momentum at our back and the courts on our side. We are working with our allies to both repeal laws designed to block access to abortion care and move forward policies that support women and families.

In August of 2015, the ACLU of Kentucky partnered with the national ACLU's Disability **Rights Project. the Children's** Law Center, and Dinsmore & Shohl to file suit on behalf of two elementary school children with disabilities who had been shackled by a school resource officer.

The children were 8 and 9 years old, respectively, during three

separate incidents in which the officer locked the handcuffs around the children's biceps with their arms behind their back. On one occasion, school officials videotaped the incident which depicted the 8 year old boy shackled and crying out in pain. The 9 year old girl was twice handcuffed in this manner. Both children suffer from identifiable behavior disorders, and in their lawsuit they maintain that the

shackling was done to punish them for behavior related to their disabilities. Notably, none of the three instances resulted in either child being arrested or charged with any criminal wrongdoing.

Susan Mizner, disability counsel for the ACLU. states that "Using law enforcement to discipline students with disabilities only serves to traumatize children. It makes behavioral issues worse and interferes with the school's role in developing appropriate educational and behavioral plans for them."

Nationally, students with disabilities make up 12 percent of the student population. but are 75 percent of the students who are physically restrained by adults in their schools, according to the U.S. Department of Education. These disciplinary practices also feed into the "school-toprison pipeline," where children are funneled out of public schools and into the criminal iustice system. Many of these children have disabilities, vet instead of receiving necessary educational and counseling services, they are often punished and pushed out.

"Kentucky's school personnel are prohibited from using restraints, especially mechanical restraints. to punish children or as a way to force behavior compliance," said Kim Tandy. executive director of the Children's Law Center. "These regulations include school resource officers. These are not situations where law enforcement action was necessary."

The complaint, S.R. v. Kenton County Sheriff's Office. was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky and remains pending. 5 The commitment of volunteer attornevs is an integral part of the ACLU of Kentucky's work. As discriminatory, anti-LGBT legislation has proliferated across the nation, corporate America has taken notice. Last summer, Indiana reportedly lost \$1.5 billion in convention and tourism business after passage of a so-called "Religious Freedom" bill; the NCAA and NASCAR even spoke out against the legislation.

The Williams Institute, a think tank devoted to research on sexual orientation and gender identity law and public policy, found that implementation of sweeping legislation in North Carolina that nullified local anti-discrimination protections and barred transgender people from using the public restroom matching their gender identity, could cost that state almost \$5 billion a year in economic activity.

In recognition of the corporate support we have in Kentucky, last fall the ACLU of Kentucky, along with our partners in the Fairness Coalition, launched the Kentucky Competitive Workforce Coalition. The KCWC is made up of some of Kentucky's leading employers, home-grown corporations, and small businesses who've come together to express their strong support for statewide, non-discrimination protections for the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community.

They recognize that a Statewide Fairness law would make it possible for companies to recruit and retain the best, hardest working, and most talented individuals without impediment, keeping Kentucky competitive in workforce recruitment and retention.

This law—which would simply update Kentucky's Civil Rights Act to include sexual orientation and gender identity—is good for Kentucky businesses and it's the right thing to do. We are partnering with our corporate community to ensure no Kentuckian is discriminated against because of who they are or who they love




We are in it for the long haul, pursuing victory even if it takes years or decades to achieve. We've been fighting for repeal of Kentucky's death penalty since 1976. Our former Executive Director Suzy Post and Carl Enoch brought together the group that later became the Kentucky Coalition to Abolish the Death Penalty. Over the years, our statewide coalition has won some important victories in this fight, including this year, when for the first time the House Judiciary Committee held a hearing with a vote on the repeal bill. While the bill fell two votes short of advancing to the full House, it was an important step forward. The historic hearing was covered extensively by media across the state, educating thousands of Kentuckians on why people of faith, conservatives, family members of victims of violence, and more have joined us in our efforts to repeal the commonwealth's broken death penalty system.


3 Executions in Kentucky since 1976

For Bob Sachs, the ACLU's commitment to civil liberties has been the core of its mission. As the former president of the ACLU of Kentucky, his leadership has strengthened and expanded its work, and he continues to serve as a powerful example of what can happen when a concerned citizen joins the struggle to protect the rights and liberties that are constitutionally guaranteed to them.

As a law student at Northwestern University in Chicago in the 1960s. Bob founded a campus civil rights organization called Northwestern Law Students for Civil Rights Under Law. Inspired by the civil rights movement that was blooming across the nation. Bob and his classmates secured

a maior success when they achieved the integration of downtown campus housing.

After moving to

Louisville in 1971. Bob ioined the Louisville affiliate of the Kentucky Civil Liberties Union. the precursor of the ACLU of Kentucky. He worked with influential ACI U leaders like Charlie Pratt to merge the two groups

into one statewide organization, led at the time by executive director. Suzv Post. a trailblazer for reproductive rights in Kentucky. "I can't honestly remember if meeting Suzy Post spurred me to join or if joining led me to meet Suzy. In any event, she has had a profound effect on my life," Bob said.

Defending civil liberties has been Bob's mission since his youth, and under his presidency, the ACLU fought for marriage equality, reproductive rights, voting rights, ending discrimination, rights to privacy and due process, and the First Amendment freedoms of speech, religion, press, and assembly.

Today, years after he led the ACLU of Kentucky as president, Bob and his wife. Felice. continue to support the work of the ACLU through their generous contributions. He also encourages others to do the same. "I find ... that our friends tend to think like us when it comes to basic civil liberties issues and I believe my passion spills over to their giving," he said.
